### **Museum of Modern Art**



The National Museum of Modern Art was founded in 1934 together with the National Museum of History and Fine Arts. Forty-one years later, October 16, 1975 after an administrative restructuring, the concept that we know today is Carlos Merida Museum.

The Museum is located in building No.6 of the Finca Nacional La Aurora, which long ago was an old dance hall and receptions of the group of buildings built during the government of General Ubico.

Two years later, the project was separated from the University and moved to 16th street between 5th and 6th

avenues of the Historic Center.

Later in 2001 Ingrid Klussmann ceded the direction of El Túnel to her son Pedro Solis and moved its headquarters to Plaza Obelisco in zone 10 where it is currently located.

## G&T Continental Foundation Gallery




## Rozas-Botran Foundation
